

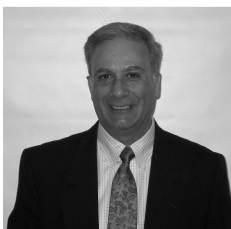

Our Purpose

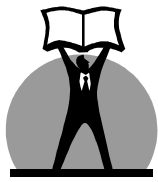

The WORD of Their Testimony

The Past

I was 25 years old in 1979 when **the Lord saved me in the most miraculous way**. It was a Thursday morning in Fort Lauderdale, Florida during "Spring Break" in April. It was a day I will *never* forget because there would *never* be another day like it. Something was telling me it was going to be "**my day**" and I was not sure why. I even said that to myself, not knowing that it was going to be **my spiritual birthday**.

That entire week challenged my heart and thoughts about the sinful condition of the world and its youth. I said, "If this is what my generation is bringing into the world, we don't stand a chance". I felt we were on a **downward spiral** that could not be corrected and the world was in big trouble. At about 8 p.m. that evening, I met a girl who was sharing her faith in Jesus. She was affiliated with the Campus Crusade for Christ and she began to explain the **GOSPEL** to me. We asked each other questions about the Bible and about Jesus. She finally convinced me, and I said to her, "**I tried just about everything else, I might as well try Jesus**" (Romans 10: 9-10).

The next thing I know I was filled with the **Holy Spirit**, I saw the bright white light of God, knew that my sins were forgiven, felt a cleansing like a Holy waterfall going through me and trembled from His power. I sensed his Holy love toward me. I wept on a public sidewalk, not caring who saw me and said to myself and the Lord, "**Why me, after all the things I've done wrong?**" I walked this girl about 10 blocks back to her meeting hall and met other Christians. This was all new to me, but because I had the gift of discernment, I could tell they knew Jesus like I knew Him. I said out loud to them, "You know, you know, and you know Jesus." I stayed a while and then they had to leave. I ran across the parking field

and jumped up yelling, "**I found the answer, and it is JESUS!**"

As I walked back to my hotel, I could see into the spirit realm and recognize all those who were "unsaved" and demon possessed. It looked like Halloween with young faces covered with hair, claws, skin lesions, and chains. It got worse as I got to the thicker part of the crowd. I looked away and walked on the narrow 6" strip of cement sidewalk all the way back to the Merriweather Hotel.

I wanted to tell my brother what had happened (Matt. 7:14). I knew this was something **I wanted to tell everyone** because I was a new creature in Christ. I had a fresh new start and my emptiness and painful hurts were removed. I was healed from my past sins and loneliness. God came in like a flood and touched every part of my being. It was a day that would change my life forever. **The peace of God is like a beautiful calm day by the water's edge**. Only He can give you that peace, when you cast all your burdens on Him.

When I returned to New York, I started to read the Bible and words and phrases would jump out at me with profound meaning and revelation. I would hold my eyes open until I was too tired to read another word and would fall asleep. His word was food for my spiritually starving soul, and I was feasting on it like it was Thanksgiving. I can't imagine where I would be right now if I never let Jesus into my heart. Every day is a new adventure and His blessings cannot be contained. HE is an amazing God. Praise the Lord for His Love and Mercy! (Acts 4:12)

The Present

I woke up Wednesday morning December 18, feeling severe neck

pain and low back pain. I was very dizzy (not room spinning dizzy). I could not stand ANY light at all. I had indigestion and what felt like a rock in my chest spreading up into my throat. **I thought I was having a heart attack**.

After talking to my good and blessed friends, Lynn and John Baiera, **I was threatened, in a loving way**, to go to a doctor or the hospital. Lynn took me to the doctor.

The doctor immediately sent me to the hospital. He thought it was either meningitis or an aneurysm. They gave me a cat scan which ruled out the aneurysm and did a spinal tap which ruled out meningitis. They also did a chest x-ray and blood work. At 9pm they finally gave me some medication for the pain. **They concluded that I had a viral "something"** or possibly a migraine headache, even though I didn't have a headache at all, and no other symptoms connected with migraines. And I was sent home.

Pastor Ed saw me in the hospital and anointed me, and I know the church was praying.

As I was waiting in the hospital for all the different tests results, *I thought I was going to die* **But GOD...the next morning I woke up feeling great and was beyond amazed!** I was sore from the spinal tap and the IV poking around, and my neck still hurt, but I could see and the light didn't hurt! Even plain daylight was excruciating the day before. I almost felt blind, it was surreal.

I KNOW THIS WAS A MIRACLE, and I am PRAISING GOD, and want to thank you all for your prayers. I called my regular doctor who I went to first. I spoke to his secretary and told her that **GOD healed me!** She said that she believed in the **power of prayer**.

Thank all of you again for being such faithful servants to God, and to the Body of Christ

WORD of Encouragement

By Faith We Believe What?

The Bible says that “the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear” (Heb. 11:3); that all things which now exist were simply **called into existence at God’s spoken command**.

Psalms 33:6, 9 says “By the word of the Lord were the heavens made; and all the host of them by the breath of His mouth. For He spake, and it was done; He commanded, and it stood fast”.

It’s the God we read of in the Bible that we put our trust in. We believe creation was a true miracle. It was God who said “Let there be... and there was”, repeated many times in Genesis.

Psalms 148:5 says “Let them praise the name of the Lord: for He commanded and they were created”. As soon as God commanded, they were created, **not over long ages, but immediately**. “For God who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ” (1 Cor. 4:6). This is also especially true of the creation of light. “And God said, Let there be light: and there was light” (Gen. 1:3).

This was not a slow and sporadic arrival of light from distant stars, nor a gradual heating up of the sun as interstellar gas collapsed and fused. If Scripture alone is our authority, **then it happened suddenly and spectacularly**.

2 Corinthians 5:17 “If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature”. No more time is required for the transformation than for darkness to turn into light at God’s command. We

are **saved by the grace of God**, not by works of righteousness.

The future can be a scary place. The unknown can be overwhelming, especially when the known has so many struggles. That’s why we need to trust in what God has promised. Whatever troubles the world will be in, God said, “I will never leave you, nor forsake you” (Hebrews 13:5). And Jesus said “I am with you always, even to the end of the age” (Matt. 28:20). **With all the things going on in this world, remember these promises of the Lord.** When the Lord speaks, it’s done. We may not know what the future holds, but we can trust the One who holds the future. It’s the word of the Lord we trust.

Paul writes, “For this cause also thank we God without ceasing, because, when ye received the word of God which ye heard of us, ye received it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe” (1 Thess. 2:13).

In spite of our struggles and stumbles, **God loves and accepts us as we are**. God told Jeremiah, “Before I formed you, I knew and approved of you” (Jer. 1:5).

We need to stop worrying about being rejected when we don’t perform perfectly. The world operates like that, but not God. Like Jacob’s limp, sometimes God leaves flaws in us to remind us how much we need Him each day.

Sin not confessed is like a stone in your shoe, get it out. No matter how bad things look, stay on top of the situation! Keep believing God. Keep believing and standing on His word. When we trust the power of God, His peace keeps us from panic. We need to be taken to the refining place. To have sin chopped away. Like someone who works on stone and chops away to form something.

To get a word from God, we need to be in the word. Be excited for God. It’s time to get into enemy territory. We are not of this world but still in the world. Follow and trust in Jesus by faith. **When the Lord gives us a word, it’s time to step out in faith**

WORD Works Library

The Word Works Library was birthed back at the little white church on Atlantic Avenue in 2005 through the cooperative efforts of the congregants. The name is derived from the simple statement that - **His Word Works**.

After the move to Greeley Avenue, a room was dedicated and shelving built to house the growing collection of Bibles, books, videos and other media. The materials were catalogued, categorized and carded and the **library reopened in the fall of 2008**.

Since the reopening donations have continued to pour in – our cup runneth over and our shelves too! **We would like to thank everyone for their generous donations and continued support.**

We now have a large variety of Christian materials including bibles, Bible studies, inspirational works, topical books (counseling, marriage, family etc.), and fiction. Authors include Billy Graham, Charles Stanley, Chuck Swindoll, and Max Lucado - to name a few.

The Word Works library, adjacent to the Pastor's conference room at the back of the church, is accessible before and after services, and during bible studies, and other church activities. To check out a book simply fill out the card in the back of the book and leave it in the box provided. Return books by leaving them in the designated location. We will gently remind you if the book is not returned in a reasonable amount of time. In addition we replace the cards and re-shelve returned books.

The library is equipped with a stereo (with a CD player), a TV and a VCR to assist in the use of the materials. We are asking for the donation of a DVD player. Overall the space is intended to provide a serene comfortable spot for individuals and small groups to read or study.

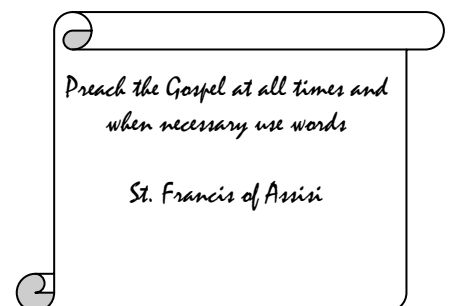
The Bible Gateway www.biblegateway.com

Also contains a Strong's number search tool that searches a Hebrew/Greek concordance plus a lexicon, for any Strong's number. Other bible translations are available. The site also contains links to an extensive set of text, audio and video commentaries. Other features too numerous to mention – take a look for yourself!

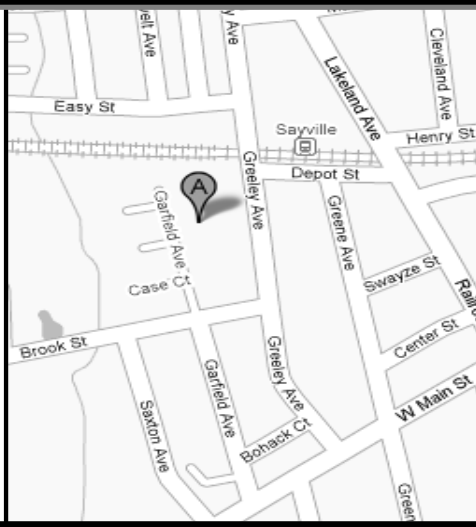
